

PDF – ein riesiges Thema!

Die PDF-Technologie hat sich seit 1993 als Erfindung einer einzelnen Firma zu einem gigantischen Ökosystem mit Tausenden von Anbietern entwickelt. Einst ein proprietäres Dateiformat, ist PDF heute wesentlicher Teil der globalen IT-Infrastruktur – ein offener ISO-Standard, der in fast jedem Sektor und fast jeder Branche weltweit eingesetzt wird. Bei den vielen Einsatzmöglichkeiten – und den vielen Fachstandards von PDF – ist es manchmal schwer, den Überblick zu behalten.
